

CUSTOMERS OF WATERLOO WATER & LIGHT COMMISSION

Waterloo Water & Light Commission has filed an application with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) to increase electric rates. The adjustment is necessary in order to cover costs associated with the construction of a new substation, a 24.9 kV loop and a 24.9 kV extension to the East sub as outlined in the Certificate of Authority docket 6220-CE-105 with the Public Service Commission. In addition, the adjustment will cover increased operation and maintenance expenses that will allow the utility to continue providing reliable and quality service to our customers. The last electric rate increase was approved in September 2017.

The utility is requesting an overall increase of 12.29%, or \$469,329. The final impact of the rate increase upon individual customers will not be definitely known until the PSC issues an order; however, under the proposed rate structure, based on an average usage of 684 kilowatt-hours (kWh), the typical residential customer's monthly bill would increase from \$76.39 per month to \$86.38 per month, an increase of \$9.99 or 13.1%.

The PSC will conduct a public hearing at locations in Waterloo and Madison or by telephone. A notice of the hearing will be published after a date has been set.
